## Discussion Questions

  2. Read **John 1:4–5** aloud. What key words stand out to you? How would you put in your own words what John is saying about Jesus?
  3. One of the indicators of early Christians was valuing people equally. People began to be viewed as brother and sister rather than primarily Jew/gentile, male/female, slave/free. Do you feel you value people equally? If so, what makes you say that? If not, what area could use your attention?
  4. Who or what would an outside observer say your king is? Why?
  5. Being a participator in God's kingdom is different than just being a believer. Would you say you are a participator? If so, how? Would you like to be more of a participator? If so, in what way?
